
We had a **EDITOR'S** GREAT meet-**CORNER** ing at the

TWO \$500 Theatre Production Student Travel Grants.

Grant money may be used for travel to and from Long Beach and / or conferenc fees or lodging. Travel Grants may be awarded to not more than one Graduate and one Undergraduate student, currently enrolled in an accredited theatre program within the HOA region boundaries (Arkansas, Oklahoma, Missouri, Kansas, and Nebraska) at the time of application. Applicants need not be current members of USITT (conference registration for non-members includes one year USITT membership.)

Grants are awarded to students who have demonstrated excellence and dedication in Theatre Production. Areas include, but are not limited to: costume, set or properties construction, sound engineering, lighting technology, rigging, stage management, or run crew management. **This is not a design award!** There are design awards available eslewhere, these awards are limited to Theatre Production. If a particular design incorporates techniques not normally used or uniquely applied, it <u>may</u> still be eligible.

Applicants will submit:

- 1. Letter of application
- 2. Letter of nomination from their supervising faculty member
- B. Documentation of current enrollment in accredited theatre program within the HOA region boundries
- 4. One page theatre resume
- 5. One two page description of involvement in a particular theatre production project completed within the last 18 months, plus documentation (photographs, draftings, cue sheets, etc.) Applications are judged on quality not quantity..
- 6. Recipients are expected to give a brief (15 minute) presentation at the HOA section meeting during the Long Beach, CA conference.
